Join Finlay Sutton for an immersive two-day masterclass focused on the art of removable partial dentures. This course is designed for dentists, clinical dental technicians, and dental technicians, providing them with the knowledge and skills to create functional, aesthetically pleasing partial dentures that can serve as viable alternatives to dental implant-supported restorations.

I will present the techniques I use to make partial dentures which function like "removable bridges", proving they are still a viable alternative to dental implant-supported restorations. Additionally, I will present a design system which allows for future modification and tooth additions onto cobalt chromium minor connectors in the event of support teeth failure, which is particularly relevant in the heavily restored dentition. The partial denture design is based on a solid chassis (major connector) splinting mobile teeth and protecting their periodontium from heavy occlusal forces. As well as discussing tooth positioning and partial denture occlusion, I will show how I make accurate impressions to create precisely fitting partial dentures. In summary,

I will share the steps I use to achieve predictable results for RPDs in partially dentate patients and patients with maxillofacial defects, showing how I manage many combinations of missing teeth.

Finlay is a Specialist in Prosthodontics based in the UK having specifically chosen to limit his clinical practice to the discipline of dentures.

As well as demonstrating the techniques in producing optimal functioning and natural looking dentures another important aim is to ignite enthusiasm for removable prosthodontics proving that dentures are a valid treatment modality even in the age of dental implants.

Finlay qualified as a dentist in 1993 and spent 6 years in general dental practice. During this time he found denture provision (and prosthodontics in general) unpredictable and as a result very stressful. This led him to leave general practice and gain a further 6 years formal training in prosthodontics and restorative dentistry at Manchester and Liverpool dental hospitals prior to starting his specialist referral practice in 2007.

Finlay now concentrates his professional life within three areas of removable prosthodontics, namely;

1. clinical provision of dentures for patients,
2. training/lecturing for dentists, clinical dental technicians and dental technicians,
3. research and development

Finlay loves spending the rest of his time with his family and friends. Additionally, he enjoys running, playing badminton, meditating and reading.

Aims, objectives and anticipated outcomes:

- Increase professional satisfaction and rekindle enthusiasm for partial dentures
- Make partial dentures as stable, comfortable, and secure as possible
- Gain a thorough understanding of a step-by-step design sequence
- Optimise the aesthetics of partial dentures
- Make accurate impressions of the hard and soft tissues for cobalt chromium castings
- Record occlusal relations accurately using gothic arch tracing
- Design partial dentures to limit periodontal damage
- Adjust partial dentures without compromising their fit
- Ensure partial dentures fit and function like removable bridges
- Improve patient satisfaction and outcomes
- Enhance communication with dental technicians
- Learn that Scandinavian Hygienic RPD designs are superior to classic British/ American designs for partially dentate patients, including maxillofacial removable prosthodontics.
- Understand the construction methods and function of partial dentures which work like removable bridges, protecting the periodontium of compromised abutment teeth.
- Appreciate that well-designed and well-made removable dentures are valid alternatives to implant-supported restorations.
- Learn a system of partial denture design which anticipates future abutment failure, allowing artificial tooth additions onto cobalt chromium minor connectors of the denture later.
